## Federal Court strikes down cabinet order labelling plastics toxic; federal government to appeal

On November 16, the Federal Court <u>struck down</u> the federal government's decision to add "plastic manufactured items" to the List of Toxic Substances in Schedule 1 of the Canadian Environmental Protection Act, 1999. The ruling does not undo the government's ban but would require the federal regulations to be rolled back. The federal government has since announced that it will appeal the ruling. FBC-ABC will continue to monitor, in particular how this development may impact the federal governments related initiatives, such as the Pollution Prevention Planning Notice.

## **UN Special Rapporteur on Contemporary Forms of Slavery request to meet** with employers

The Commissioner for Employers, Nancy Healey, has reached out to the Temporary Foreign Worker Task Force, which FBC-ABC is a member of, to request suggestions of specific employers the UN Special Rapporteur should meet with in advance of his drafting of a final report on Canada's Temporary Foreign Worker Program. As FBC-ABC members may recall, the September <a href="interim report">interim report</a> acknowledged that the Special Rapporteur did not actually visit any farms or plants, nor did he meet with any employers. ### Prime Minister holds roundtable discussion on food affordability during trip to San Francisco

In a visit to San Francisco last week, the Prime Minister held a roundtable discussion on food affordability with both Canadian and American stakeholders. The fresh produce sector appeared to be prominent, with representatives from the International Fresh Produce Association and the Canadian Produce Marketing Association participating. # Governments of Canada and Ontario investing up to \$25M to boost efficiency in farming and food processing

This week, the governments of Canada and Ontario <u>announced</u> that they are investing up to \$25M through the Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership (Sustainable CAP) to expand production capacity and boost energy efficiency in the agriculture and food sector. Through the Agri-Tech Innovation Initiative, funding will be provided to eligible farm and food processing businesses to help them invest in innovative technology, equipment or processes.
