Cabinet meets in Montreal; Prime Minister announces Team Canada engagement strategy to promote and defend Canada's interests in and with the United States

This week, members of Cabinet concluded their retreat in Montreal, where they discussed issues including housing, combatting organized crime, and the recent announcement on international students. Following the retreat, the Prime Minister announced that the Minister of Innovation, Science and Industry, Francois Philippe-Champagne, and the Minister of Export Promotion, International Trade and Economic Development, Mary Ng will co-lead a renewed Team Canada engagement strategy to promote and defend Canada's

interests in and with the United States. FBC-ABC is seeking out further details on this.

This week, the Prime Minister <u>announced</u> the appointment of Mary Robinson as an independent Senator to fill a vacancy in the Senate for Prince Edward Island. Mary Robinson is the past President of the Canadian Federation of Agriculture. FBC-ABC will be sending a letter of congratulations.

Canada to decrease number of new international student permits This week, the Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship announced the Government will set a cap on international student study permits leading to a decrease of 35% from 2023. Additionally, the Government is changing the eligibility criteria of the Post-Graduation Work Permit Program, as well as making open work permits only available to spouses of international students in master's and doctoral programs.
