## Minister Champagne meets with international and Canadian food and beverage manufacturers

This week, the Honourable Francois-Philippe Champagne, Minister of Innovation, Science and Industry alongside the Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food met with <u>major international food and beverage manufacturers</u> (Monday) as well as Canadian companies (Tuesday), including members of Food and Beverage Canada. Conversations focused on the importance of the Grocery Code of Conduct, and in manufacturers working in parallel with retailers to support new strategies to address grocery prices in Canada. The department did not issue a release following the Tuesday meeting.

## Canada announces first-ever category-based selection invitations for newcomers with work experience in agriculture and agri-food

On September 27, the government <u>announced</u> that the first round of invitations for agriculture and agri-food occupations through category-based selection in Express Entry will occur this week. This includes 2021 NOC code 63201 – Butchers – retail and wholesale. These category-based selection rounds will continue throughout the year, alongside general and program-specific invitation rounds.
